The publications include i.a. country studies, such as Myanmar, Thailand and Malaysia, books on ASEAN and the two series "Trends in Southeast Asia" and "Southeast Asian Affairs". The collection includes publications from the years 1980-2019. The titles are searchable in full text. They can be downloaded as PDF as well as borrowed and read offline in an app.</p>

Foreign Office Files for South East Asia, 1963-1980	Archival Documents	This essential collection of British Foreign Office files explores the history of South East Asia in the mid-twentieth century against the backdrop of the Cold War and the earlier Malayan Emergency (1948-1960). Following the formation of the Federation of Malaysia, and the reaction to this in the wider region, Foreign Office Files for South East Asia, 1963-1980 showcases a fascinating period of history. Covering key regions including Malaysia, Indonesia, Singapore and the Philippines, the material in this collection shines a light on key historical events for this period through memoranda, reports, correspondence, telegrams, speeches and maps. This collection provides crucial insights into this period of history from a British perspective, with documents covering the release of the Cobbold Commission Report, led by the formation of the Federation of Malaysia and a rising fear of the threat of communism in a time of conflict and economic uncertainty. These documents provide comprehensive

		detail on the concerns of the British government as they attempted to re-establish their global role in the postcolonial period, with coverage of the casualties of Commonwealth countries during guerrilla warfare, financial records and correspondence detailing strategies and motive during a period of rapid transformation.

The official digital dissertations archive for the Library of Congress and the database of record for graduate research. PQDT – Full Text includes 2.7 million searchable citations to dissertation and theses from around the world from 1861 to the present day together with 1.2 million full text dissertations that are available for download in PDF format. Over 2.1 million titles are available for purchase as printed copies. The database offers full text for most of the dissertations added since 1997 and strong retrospective full text coverage for older graduate works.
CEIC Data	Statistical Data	CEIC Data's Global Database contains over a million time series covering economies from the US and China to economies such as Bulgaria and Chile or Southeast Asian countries like Vietnam, Myanmar, Thailand, Laos or Indonesia. It covers key indicators such as GDP, GNP, FDI, and CPI as well as detailed, hard to find information on inflation, exports, and tourism. Built on the expertise of professionals on the ground in numerous emerging countries, CEIC Data offers users exclusive access to a knowledge store that will enable them to make only the smartest and most accurate assessments and decisions.
Library Press Display	Newspapers and Journals	The database gives access to 1965 newspapers – on the day they are published, and 90 days retrospectively – from 87 countries in 42 languages. For the region South East Asia these are five newspapers from Vietnam (three in English, one in French, one in Vietnamese), two newspapers (only) in English from Cambodia, 14 from Thailand (11 in English, two in Tai, one in German), and 20 newspapers from Malaysia (10 in English, six in Malay, four in Chinese). The database may be searched by country, by language, or alphabetically by the newspapers title in the time ranges today, last three days, this week, this month, or anytime (which means the last 90 days).

The Journal of the Burma Research Society	Academic Journal	The Journal of the Burma Research Society was an academic journal covering Burma studies that was published by the Burma Research Society between 1911 and 1980. When it began publication in 1911, the journal became the first peer-reviewed academic journal focused on Burma studies. Over the 69-year period, the journal published 59 volumes and 132 issues, including over 1,300 articles. It was published twice a year at the Rangoon University Estate in both English and Burmese. The collection covers the full journal with all its issues.
Digital Library of Northern Thai Manuscripts	Manuscripts	The Digital Library of Northern Thai Manuscripts (DLNTM) is designed as a resource for the study of traditional literature from this region. At present, the digital library contains images of over 4,200 manuscripts which can be searched and viewed online or freely downloaded, and to which more manuscripts will be added. Collaborating institutions are the University of Pennsylvania, Chiang Mai University, the National Library of Laos, and Staatsbibliothek zu Berlin. The project is funded by the Henry Luce Foundation and the German Federal Foreign Office and the resource is free.
Digital Library of Lao Manuscripts	Manuscripts	The Digital Library of Lao Manuscripts (DLLM) makes images of almost 12,000 texts from throughout Laos easily accessible for study, together with related information and resources. Collaborating institutions are the National Library of Laos, University of Passau, and Staatsbibliothek zu Berlin. The project is funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG) and the German Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and the resource is free.
Malaysia Historical Collection	E-Books	The tribal history of Malaysia dates back to 40,000 years. Hindu and Buddhist-influenced kingdoms spread over the archipelago from 3rd century BC onwards, and then Islam arrived with Indian and Arab traders in the 13th century. Melaka was established as the first seat of Malay sultanate. Against this background of diverse history, culture, religion the "Malaysia Historical Collection" tries to capture the splendid first-hand account stories of people who experienced life and events happening in the Malaysia archipelago over the last 100 years. The time frame covers the British colonial period, Japanese occupation and newly independent Malaya federation.
